Dear Ethan,

I appreciate your letter and am glad to learn that you have taken you to Israel. It does not surprise me at all that the Intergraph shipments to Iran through Israel are continuing. The packages no doubt include the electronic parts required to keep the HAWK missile assembly lines at Iran Electronic Industries in operation. Lt. Col. North testified that the Iranians did not accept the HAWKS shipped by Israel and he had a difficult time arranging for their return. As indicated in the enclosed excerpts from his testimony, they had been promised Super HAWKS. They had no need for the standard version because they have been able to obtain parts and assemble adequate numbers for their needs on their own production lines. Press reports indicate they have been quite successful in bringing down Iraq's high performance fighters.

The enclosed newspaper article reports on the success of a scam operation set up by a Texas sheriff in nabbing an Iranian agent. It was not parts for the missile itself the agent was seeking but parts for the ground radars which acquire the targets and guide the missiles to them. You will note the agent evidently anticipated no difficulty in getting the parts across the border into Mexico and thence to Iran.

Another aspect of Intergraph's exports has been brought into focus by the secret visit to South Africa by Mr. Clarridge of the CIA in April of 1984. As reported in the enclosed press release, Mr. Clarridge has given the congressional committees some very nebulous explanations why he made the trip. At the time of the nuclear explosion in the South Atlantic, the South African Prime Minister told the press that South Africa did not have nuclear weapons but did have weapons the press did not know about. Later Iraq used laser weapons against Iran at the same time as the gas attacks. Victims of the laser weapons flown to West Germany were found to be permanently blinded. Iran's human wave attacks suddenly ceased. Prior to his murder in November of 1984, Mr. Charles White had been in South Africa and brought back a laser cigarette lighter. The Customs agent told me that prior to the murder he was investigating reports that Mr. White was "distressed" about the fact his company was exporting high technology. The U. S. Army high energy laser weapons program at the the Army Missile Command had been cancelled in 1983. It appears to me that the technology was exported to South Africa by Intergraph to be used against human wave assaults there and that Mr. Clarridge went to South Africa to try to obtain the laser weapons for the Contras.

I am enclosing Mr. Alfonso Chardy's report in the Miami Herald for

Ausust 9. In referring to it, he has pointed out to me he has independently verified allegations I have made.

Also I am enclosing copies of my unacknowledged letters to Mr. Walsh and to the congressional committees and a copy of my note to Mr. Don Howard which I left at his office after he did not return my calls. Did you talk to him again after you last called me?

My lawsuit against Westinghouse for attempted murder is on the docket for September 21. A separate suit is being prepared to cover the FBI's instigating violation of my constitutional right to carry a weapon for my self-protection.

I wish you luck in your investigations and hope to hear from you again very soon.
